হোপ ফাউন্ডেশন ফর উইমেন এন্ড চিলড্রেন অফ বাংলাদেশ এর নবনির্মিত হাসপাতাল- 'হোপ ম্যাটার্নিটি এন্ড ফিস্টুলা সেন্টার'- উদ্বোধন হতে যাচ্ছে জেনে আমি আনন্দিত। এ উপলক্ষে হোপ ফাউন্ডেশনের প্রতিষ্ঠাতা, বোর্ড অফ ডিরেক্টরস, ডাক্তার, নার্স, কর্মচারি, দাতা প্রতিষ্ঠান এবং আমেরিকান ফিস্টুলা ফাউন্ডেশনের সকলকে আমি অভিনন্দন জানাচ্ছি।

একজন তরুণ চিকিৎসক ১৯৯৯ সালে কক্সবাজার অঞ্চলের মানুষের স্বাস্থ্য সেবা দিতে ভাড়া করা ঘরে ছোট্ট একটি ক্লিনিক দিয়ে যাত্রা শুরু করেন। তিনি কিছু শুভাকাঙ্ক্ষীদের নিয়ে আমেরিকার মিয়ামি শহরে 'হোপ ফাউন্ডেশন ফর উইমেন এন্ড চিলড্রেন অফ বাংলাদেশ' নামে একটি অলাভজনক প্রতিষ্ঠানের গোড়াপত্তন করেন। বিভিন্ন শহরে গিয়ে বাংলাদেশি ভাই-বোনদের সাহায্য নিয়ে ক্রমশ অগ্রসর হতে থাকেন। এরই ফলশ্রুতিতে এ অঞ্চলের মা ও শিশুরা নানাবিধ সেবা পেতে থাকেন। আন্তে আন্তে এ প্রতিষ্ঠান আমেরিকা এবং পৃথিবীর অন্যান্য দেশে পরিচিতি লাভ করে। সম্পূর্ণ দান নির্ভর এই প্রতিষ্ঠান সকলের সাহায্যে বাংলাদেশে এক অনন্য উদাহরণ সৃষ্টি করেছে। ছোট্ট এই প্রতিষ্ঠানটি দেশি-বিদেশি সাহায্যে আজ একটি বড় স্বাস্থ্য সেবা কেন্দ্রে পরিণত হয়েছে।

হোপ ফাউন্ডেশনের 'হোপ ম্যাটার্নিটি এন্ড ফিস্টুলা সেন্টার' একটি অত্যাধুনিক ও দৃষ্টিনন্দন হাসপাতাল। প্রসবজনিত ফিস্টুলা, মা-বোনদের জন্য এক সর্বনাশা সমস্যা। এই সমস্যার কারণে হাজার হাজার সোনার সংসার তছনছ হয়ে যাচ্ছে। দুর্গন্ধ কবলিত শরীর কোনভাবেই একজন মাকে গ্রহণযোগ্য পর্যায়ে সংসারে স্থান দেয় না, এ কারণে ঘটছে বিবাহ বিচ্ছেদ, সামাজিক বয়কট। এই সমস্যা লাঘবে হোপ ফাউন্ডেশন ২০১১ সাল থেকে কাজ করে যাচ্ছে। চট্টগ্রাম বিভাগ ও অন্যান্য বেশ কয়েকটি জেলা ফিস্টুলা মুক্ত করার লক্ষ্যে তারা ইতিমধ্যে প্রায় ৯০০ অপারেশনের মাধ্যমে মা-বোনদের সমাজে সম্মানিত আসনে ফিরিয়ে দিয়েছেন। এই হাসপাতালে পূর্ণাঙ্গ কার্যক্রম শুরু করার পূর্বেই এরকম অবদান সত্যিই প্রশংসনীয়।

আওয়ামী লীগ সরকার দেশের স্বাস্থ্যখাতে ব্যাপক উন্নয়ন পরিকল্পনা গ্রহণ করে তা বাস্তবায়ন করে যাচ্ছে। আমরা ১৯৯৮ সালে দেশের ইতিহাসে প্রথম বঙ্গবন্ধু শেখ মুজিব মেডিক্যাল বিশ্ববিদ্যালয় প্রতিষ্ঠা করি। স্বাস্থ্যসেবা ও প্রয়োজনীয় গবেষণা কর্মকাণ্ড সম্প্রসারিত করতে রাজশাহী, চট্টগ্রাম, সিলেট ও খুলনায় মেডিক্যাল বিশ্ববিদ্যালয় চালু করা হয়েছে। আমরা গণমুখী স্বাস্থ্য নীতি প্রণয়ন করেছি। এ নীতির বাস্তবায়ন করছি। হাসপাতালের শয্যা সংখ্যা, সাধারণ হাসপাতাল ও বিশেষায়িত হাসপাতাল প্রতিষ্ঠা এবং বিশেষায়িত চিকিৎসাসেবা বহুগুণে বৃদ্ধি করা হয়েছে। প্রায় সাড়ে ১৮ হাজার কমিউনিটি ক্লিনিক ও ইউনিয়ন স্বাস্থ্যকেন্দ্র গ্রামীণ জনগোষ্ঠীর স্বাস্থ্যসেবা প্রদানে নিয়োজিত রয়েছে। জাতিসংঘ 'কমিউনিটি ক্লিনিক'কে সম্প্রতি 'দ্য শেখ হাসিনা ইনিশিয়েটিভ' হিসেবে স্বীকৃতি দিয়েছে। আমরা সারাদেশে নতুন নতুন মেডিক্যাল কলেজ, ডেন্টাল কলেজ, নার্সিং কলেজ, নার্সিং ইনস্টিটিউট, মেডিক্যাল এ্যাসিস্টেন্ট ট্রেনিং স্কুল এবং হেলথ টেকনোলজি ইনস্টিটিউট প্রতিষ্ঠা করেছি।

ফিস্টুলা অপারেশন হোপ ফাউন্ডেশনের অন্যতম লক্ষ্য; পাশাপাশি তারা বিস্তৃতভাবে কক্সবাজার এবং চট্টগ্রাম বিভাগের বিভিন্ন এলাকায় মা ও শিশুদের নানাবিধ রোগ লাঘবে সেবা দিয়ে যাচ্ছে। হোপ ফাউন্ডেশন চায় বাংলাদেশকে ফিস্টুলা মুক্ত করতে, মাতৃ মৃত্যু হার শূন্যের কাছাকাছি নিয়ে আসতে। আর এ সবই তারা করে যাচ্ছে বেসরকারিভাবে এবং বিভিন্ন অনুদানের মাধ্যমে। আমি আশা করি, দেশের প্রতিটি অঞ্চলের মা-বোনেরা এই সুযোগের সদ্ব্যবহার করে দেশকে ফিস্টুলার অভিশাপ থেকে মুক্ত করবে।

আমি 'হোপ ম্যাটার্নিটি এন্ড ফিস্টুলা সেন্টার' এর উত্তরোত্তর সমৃদ্ধি কামনা করছি।


মহাপরিচালক এর বাণী

Our most anticipated event is the opening of our new health facility, Hope Maternity and Fistula Center, on May 30th, 2023. The Center alone will provide 104 more beds for women and babies in need of care.

We are pleased to report on our recent expansion into the Barisal Division in south-central Bangladesh. Our reputation for high quality and compassionate care certainly precedes us as we have been warmly welcomed into this area that has a great need for essential healthcare. Our team looks forward to bringing quality care and services to this region's under-served communities as well as look to more opportunities where we can meet their unique needs.

Obstetric Fistula Program

94 total surgeries in 2022.

Obstetric fistula is a devastating childbirth injury whereby a hole is formed between the birth canal and bladder and/or rectum caused by prolonged, obstructed labor leading to fetal death and necrosis of tissue in the birth canal. This devastating childbirth injury occurs primarily in poverty-stricken women who lack access to emergency obstetric care, education on maternal health and healthy pregnancies, and a lack decision-making power. This is compounded by Bangladesh's high rate of child marriage. Many women are not developed physically to bear children when they become pregnant, as well as being chronically malnourished due to cultural male prioritization when it comes to food security. The obstetric fistula causes women to experience pain, physical disabilities, and urinary and/or fecal incontinence. These issues result in women getting ostracized from their families, peers and communities being labeled as cursed which in turn leads to depression, anxiety, shame, trauma, poor nutrition, and a worsening socioeconomic outlook.

In Bangladesh, there are an estimated 17,457 (The Lancet, 2022) women currently suffering from obstetric fistula, with more new cases each year. This number is likely higher in reality, as obstetric fistula victims suffer and hide in silence.

Hope intervenes by utilizing a strong grassroots approach through a community outreach team (including Hope's nationally renowned surgical team) to work with the community to identify those suffering and provide them the support, information and care they deserve. Moreover, post-surgical repair, these women are eligible to participate in skill development and employment training, as well as Hope's social reintegration program. Hope ensures its approach is holistic to improve every facet of these women's lives.

Hope's commitment to eradicating obstetric fistula from Bangladesh led the team to start fistula surgery in the Barisal division at the Sher-e-Bangla Medical College. The first patient's name was Sahabanu, a 60 year old woman from Patuakhali that lived with obstetric fistula for 25 years. "How much I suffered, I just can not express it in words. I always cried", she revealed to the team. Sahabanu's surgery was successfully completed on December 14, 2022. Sahabanu is beyond grateful and feels she truly got her life back. She expressed her desire to work as a **Fistula Ambassador** with Hope's team to help other women through surgery to finally get healed. We know she will serve as an excellent Fistula Ambassador and lead with **compassion, empathy and support** to the women who's shoes she once was in.

The Maternity and Fistula Center is a new Hospital that will open its doors for service on May 30th, 2023. The Center boasts **104 beds** dedicated to **repairing obstetric fistula** and **providing the highest quality maternity care**. It aims to prevent avoidable maternal and neonatal deaths and injuries in the region by providing safe, respectful and easily accessible Emergency Obstetric and Neonatal Care. The Center will provide a safe space for our obstetric fistula patients who truly deserve a facility that understands their needs, provides the necessary resources and care, and staff that supports them on their journey. The ongoing surgical services, proper maternal care provided by this Center and all Hope facilities, and the awareness and education provided

through Hope staff to communities, it is our belief that in the future we will **eradicate** this terrible childbirth injury from the region. We are so excited to open this facility to serve the women and their families in this region. In this unique facility, we will bring patients from other parts of the country who need advanced level fistula care due to the complexity of the problem. Fistula repair surgery in this facility will be free of cost through the generous support of our donors such as the Fistula Foundation. Interested surgeons from around the country will be invited to attend the fistula surgery training program at this hospital.

Bangladesh faces challenges in combating poor maternal and neonatal outcomes in large part due to a shortage of skilled health care workers. The majority of Bangladeshi women (**72%**) live in rural areas where access to skilled care is lacking. The lack of skilled health care workers translates to needless suffering and neonatal and maternal mortalities: namely due to obstructed labor, postpartum hemorrhage, infection, and eclampsia. Hope's goal is to prevent these devastating statistics from remaining the reality, and to accomplish this, we must train midwives and deploy them to rural areas.

At the **Hope Midwifery Institute**, Hope trains young women in a 3-year diploma program who are local to the area, which not only means they will stay after their training and dedicate their work to saving women in their communities, but it also means that women from the community will **trust** them. In rural areas of Bangladesh, most women give birth with an unskilled traditional birth attendant. These attendants unfortunately engage in practices that are harmful to both the baby and mother. In order to change this societal pattern, it was necessary to create a sustainable solution that the community would trust. We know in time, the more women that become trained midwives to help safely deliver will dramatically improve maternal and neonatal health in regions that have needed it for so long.

Every Mother Counts has been proud to count Hope among our grantee partners since 2015 and is honored to support their ongoing efforts to ensure every woman has access to safe, respectful, and equitable maternity care. Through culturally concordant community education, midwifery training, and service delivery, as well as strong local and government partnerships, Hope's approach demonstrates that progress in maternal health is possible when investments begin at the community level and continue throughout a person's health journey. We look forward to continuing on this path with Hope and invite others to join us.

Safe Motherhood Program



Access to maternal health is improving in Bangladesh, yet, annually, 7,660 women die from preventable causes related to pregnancy and childbirth. A major reason for so many unnecessary deaths is lack of access to maternal and emergency obstetric care. Some barriers to care are; lack of financial means, lack of transportation, lack of doctors and qualified health care workers, lack of the ability to move independently, and a lack of education regarding the importance of pregnancy and delivery care. Moreover, many women are expected to deliver at home, at the hands of traditional birth attendants. The birth attendants that attend home deliveries are not qualified health care workers, and often engage in dangerous practices.

Hope's Safe Motherhood Program provides access to comprehensive maternal health services including antenatal care, safe delivery, postnatal care, nutrition counseling and family planning with skilled and knowledgeable health professionals, like our certified midwives.

Supported by **Every Mother Counts, USA**, this program aims to ensure that all women have access to a safe and healthy pregnancy.



Hope Birth Centers

Hope established several Birth Centers in parts of Cox's Bazar where there is a lack of access to maternal health services. Hope works in close collaboration with Government facilities in the targeted sub-districts to ensure a coordinated and comprehensive health care system, with the main interest of protecting pregnant women.

All these Birth Centers are connected to Hope Hospital 24/7 for emergency obstetric care via Hope transportation network. The Birth Centers are fully staffed and led by qualified midwives.

Cleft Surgery Program

43 total surgeries in 2022.



Every year 150,000 Bangladeshi children are born with cleft lip and palates, but surgery is very expensive and there are about 10 trained cleft surgeons in the country. Access to care is nearly impossible. Furthermore, most of these children live their lives in shame - unable to eat properly, talk, go to school and taunted by many. Because of this reason, children are even abandoned at birth by their parents.

A simple surgery can change the life of a child forever. Thanks to a partnership with SmileTrain, Hope successfully performed **43** cleft-surgery camps in 2022.

Hope Field Hospital for Women

When hundreds of thousands of desperate Rohingya refugees began flooding onto the coasts and paddy fields of southern Bangladesh in August 2017, it was the women and children who suffered the most. The refugee population – almost 60 percent of whom were women and children – poured across the border from Myanmar into Bangladesh, they brought with them accounts of the unspeakable violence and brutality that had forced them to flee. By the end of August 2022, Bangladesh was hosting more than 890,000 Rohingya refugees in the Cox's Bazar District, around half of whom were children (UNICEF, 2022). While basic services have been provided, the population still face disease outbreaks, malnutrition, inadequate educational and recreational opportunities and the risks related to neglect, exploitation and violence including gender-based violence risks, child marriage and child labour.

The Hope Field Hospital for Women located in Camp 4, provides comprehensive healthcare services to Rohingya refugees around the clock, and includes mobile health clinics, emergency transportation, emergency obstetric and pediatric health care, and mental health services. Moreover, Hope has provided medical services and necessary supplies such as first aid kits, medications, water purifying packs, and vitamins.

Mental Health Program



To address the existing shortage of mental health and psychosocial support services (MHPSS), Hope Foundation introduced in 2019 a Mental Health Program with the financial support of **Kulczyk Foundation** (KF). After completion of the collaboration with KF and great success of the program, Hope continued these mental health activities with their own funds. The program aims to provide mental health and psychosocial support along with awareness raising among the host community and for the Rohingya Refugees.

Because the Rohingya community was victimized by genocide and forcibly displaced, as a result of the extreme trauma that this community suffered, there are significant needs for mental health services to help this community process and cope with the severe psychological trauma they endured, as well as other mental health problems.

The Hope mental health team has been working in close partnership with the community, creating outreach activities that provide mental health support and treatment at the camp level. Additionally, pregnant and postpartum women in both the host and refugee community suffer from some unavoidable mental health problems, especially postpartum depression.

The Hope mental health team provides ongoing direct mental health and psychosocial support services (MHPSS) through individual counseling and support groups as well as carrying out community mobilization and awareness raising activities.

Hope Emergency Response Team

Hope team responded to the 2022 floods in Sylhet. Medical support is most important together with food and basic needs items. Our team provided emergency service constantly, by establishing health camps to provide medical care and by distributing important basic needs items such as soap, superfoods, water purification pills, vitamins and more. Hope Foundation wants to reach out to all women and provide the access to healthcare they deserve. In 2022 **Hope expanded its services to the Barisal Division**, located in the south-central region of Bangladesh.

For the past 12 years, the Hope team has been providing fistula care and has built a strong fistula care team in Bangladesh through its work in the 11 districts of Bangladesh's Chattogram division. Now Hope is expanding it's work to the Barisal division starting at the Barisal Medical College Hospital and Rahat Anwar Hospital. Dr. Mahmood (Hope's Founder) recently visited several districts within the Barisal division to introduce Hope's obstetric fistula work. He was welcomed by Civil Surgeon's offices, medical colleges, district hospitals, NGOs and social organizations to implement the obstetric fistula program. Furthermore, Hope **opened two Hope Health Centers in the Barguna District** and started **organizing Mothers' Club meetings** in the area. We could not be more encouraged and hopeful to begin serving the women and their families in this area.

New Partnerships



Jagannath University Psychology Department (Mental Health Program)

An agreement of collaboration was signed between the Department of Psychology, Jagannath University and Hope. This joint collaboration's aim is to invest in community mental health care, research and publication.

Food for the Hungry

Hope is opening new health centers with the support of **Food for the Hungry**. Thanks to the joint collaboration, Hope was able to open 2 medical clinics that are currently running and fully staffed with doctors, midwives and support staff providing 24/7 care. Furthermore, **Food for the Hungry** financially supported Hope's important efforts at the Hope Field Hospital for Women.



Rotary Club of Metropolitan Dhaka (Uterine Prolapse Program)

During the 40th installation ceremony of Rotary Club of Metropolitan Dhaka in September 2022, Hope Foundation was accepted as a partner officially at the event, and Dr. Mahmood was given the honor to speak to the audience. At the event a generous check was awarded to the uterine prolapse surgery program of Hope Foundation. A Global Grant has been submitted to support Hope's surgical activities and develop a program to care for women with debilitating condition called uterine prolapse. This grant, if approved, will relieve many elderly women from tremendous suffering.

I have had the extreme honor of working with the Hope Foundation for Women and Children of Bangladesh since 2020. Although I was amazed by their exceptional work going through all their reports, the news, and talking with people who volunteered with Hope, nonetheless, this was all eclipsed when I visited their different facilities in the Summer of 2022. The levels of their team's dedication and the scope of services this organization provides in exceptionally challenging conditions testify to its uniqueness.

As the University of Nebraska Medical Center lead faculty coordinating all our work with Hope, I have witnessed firsthand their dedication and commitment to addressing critical health issues for the local and refugee communities alike.

University of Nebraska Medical Center Visit



Hope Foundation Founder Dr. Iftikher Mahmood, together with Hope Board Director Dr. Siraj Ul Islam, visited the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) with five delegates from Bangladesh, led by the Honorable Minister Zahid Maleque, MP of the Bangladesh Ministry of Health and Family Welfare on December 19th and 20th, 2022. The Director General of Health Services of Bangladesh Dr. ABM Khurshid Alam also accompanied the Bangladesh delegation. The aim of this important visit was to collaborate and address the health needs of Bangladesh, including the **establishment of a national cancer program, a national organ transplant program, vaccine research and development program, health security and bio-preparedness**. During the signing ceremony, members of both teams were present including Dr. Wael Elrayes, Co-Director of the UNMC College of Public Health's Center for Global Health and Development, and Dr. Jane Meza, Director of Global Engagement.

This agreement of collaboration will lead to major improvements in the areas of cancer care, organ transplant programs, health security and vaccine research in Bangladesh. Student Scholarships

Through the generous support of the Suzanne and Ward Chamber's Fellowship, I traveled to Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh to conduct a participatory evaluation study in collaboration with the Hope Foundation for Women and Children of Bangladesh. Along with the Hope Foundation's research team, I conducted semi-structured interviews and focus groups with providers and administrators to assess the implementation of the **gender-based violence (GBV) screening and referral process within Hope's Field Hospital**. Additionally, I had the opportunity to **conduct two gender-based violence 101 trainings** for providers and staff in the organization. GBV is a critical global health issue, and Hope Foundation is committed to addressing it among Rohingya women and girls. Our collaborative research team **presented our evaluation's preliminary findings at the Sexual Violence Research Initiative (SVRI) Forum 2022** in Cancun, Mexico. During my time in Cox's Bazar, I also had the opportunity to visit with Majhis from the Rohingya community, enjoy Bangladeshi hospitality and delicious cuisine, and relax on the Kolatoli Beach with a cup of tea with the team from Hope Foundation. Thank you, Dr. Mahmood and the Hope Foundation team, for the opportunity to co-design an evaluation that was **culturally and trauma informed**.




Emergency Obstetric Surgery from 2018 to 2022




Antenatal Care from 2018 to 2022




Obstetric Fistula Surgery from 2018 to 2022
